- Provides insight and expertise from educational theory, research and data on serving African American students, and design practices in preparing faculty and subject matter experts (SMEs) for successful online course design.
- Helps define educational goals, learner needs, and choose appropriate delivery method.

- Closely monitors and facilitates the entire course development process with the assigned subject matter expert (SMEs), including regular meetings to ensure the project stays on track for on time, on specification completion.
- Utilize design documents (templates, storyboards, design mock-ups), as part
 of the course development manual, to guide the course development
 process.
- Maintain course design and technology for active courses.
- Participate and provide expertise based on accepted educational practice in assessment planning, mapping, rubric development, evaluation, and execution within the assigned academic unit(s).
- Collaborate in providing instruction in accordance with the philosophy of the Umoja Community and within the scope of defined courses, programs of study, and degrees.
- Assume responsibility to keep current in the field of study/area of expertise and continue to develop professionally in content, methodologies, and distance strategies.
- Keep accurate electronic records for all design and redesign projects and submit records when required.
- Reports regularly to supervisor on assignments and progress.
