In keeping with this tradition of access, excellence, and affordability, UC’s vision is to improve degree attainment, grow enrollment for our California student, and ensure they receive stellar instruction from a diverse faculty.

Already a national leader in degree attainment with a 6 year graduation rate of 84.4% We can do better.

Improving degree attainment through **reducing time to degree** and **closing the degree attainment gap** between underrepresented students, low-income students and first generation students and other students will

- ✓ Increase the affordability of a UC education
- ✓ Expand equity in access
- ✓ Promote economic mobility for our students

By 2030, 2 out of every 5 jobs will require a B.A. degree. UC has already added more than 14,000 California resident undergraduate students in the last 4 years. To meet the workforce demands of the future, UC will meet its public service mission by expanding enrollment over the next decade.

25% of UC faculty are themselves UC alumni. Our faculty should reflect the state’s diversity. UC efforts to increase faculty diversity include strategic efforts to hire more underrepresented and female faculty.

UC's commitment to junior-level transfer students is seen in our progress to achieving a 2:1 transfer:freshman ratio.

These three campuses offer transfer students the opportunity to earn their UC degree in a community that will support them, challenge them and prepare them for the next step.



UC will begin a new system-wide transfer guarantee in 2019 for CA residents. This is another opportunity for students to earn a UC degree while minimizing their costs.

84% of transfer students graduate in 3 years, 58% graduate in two.

This plan will only apply to students who begin attending a CCC in Fall 2019.

UC faculty continue to finalize details, and the plan will be ready and announced prior to Fall 2019.




