Academic and social integration, through counseling, culturally relevant pedagogy and tailored learning communities, leads to increased student engagement, persistence, and academic performance (Tinto, 1993; Nora, 2006; and Zhao and Kuh, 2004).

Short-Term Outcomes

The short-term outcomes of the program activities were selected to track the process of student academic and social integration into the institution, measured through changes in student engagement, attitude and awareness.

Student engagement

Student engagement is defined as "the time and effort students devote to activities that are empirically linked to desired outcomes of college and what institutions do to induce students to participate in these activities" (Kuh, 2001, 2003, 2009). Coates (2007) describes engagement as "a broad construct intended to encompass salient academic as well as certain non-academic aspects of the student experience" comprising the following:

- active and collaborative learning;
- participation in challenging academic activities;
- · formative communication with academic staff;
- involvement in enriching educational experiences;
- feeling legitimated and supported by university learning communities.

We intended to measured faculty and student participation in engagement activities, including: faculty participation in the Summer Learning Institute, faculty and student participation in the annual conference, and the northern and southern regional symposia, and student participation in Umoja activities. Information on participation in Umoja activities was not available beyond what was caputured by the student survey. Using the student survey, we used three items to measure the student's perception of the frequency of contact between the student and the Umoja coordinator, along a four-point scale, from "strongly disagree" = 1 to "strongly agree" = 4:

- I regularly interacted with him or her,
- I saw him or her at least once a semester, and
- He/She helped me make plans for the future.

We used seven items to measure student perceptions regarding the quality of their interactions with peers and faculty in the classroom, along a five-point scale, from "strongly agree" = 1 to "strongly disagree" = 5:

- I had meaningful interactions with other students,
- I made relationships that will carry on after the program.
- I had meaningful interactions with the instructor,
- I felt like the instructor really cared about my progress and what I was learning,
- I felt supported by the other students or the instructor,
- The instructor or the other students adequately explained the material to me,
- I developed real mentors that will help me in the future, and
- I feel more connected to other Umoja students.

We used seven items to measure student perceptions regarding the importance of Umoja program features, along a four-point scale, from "not at all important" = 1 to "very important" = 4:

- Using tutors,
- Knowing peers with similar goals,
- Having a mentor,
- Having enough time to study,
- Having a personal connection with faculty.
- Participation in programs like this one,
- Financial stability or access to resources (including financial aid), and
- Other (please describe).

Sense of belonging

Academic and social integration into the institution encompasses both the student's perceived sense of belonging (psychological) and the student's actual participation in campus life (behavioral). We intended to measure student participation in campus life by tracking participation in Umoja activities, however this information was not available. Sense of belonging is the student's psychological sense of social integration, the feeling of "fitting in" to the campus community. We used five items to measure sense of belonging (Hurtado et. al 1998), measured on a five-point scale, from "strongly agree" = 1 to "strongly disagree" = 5:

- I feel like I belong at my school,
- I feel well connected to my peers at my school,
- I see myself as part of the campus community,
- People who look like me are welcomed at my school, and
- I feel as though I am member of this college community.

Racial Climate

A student's perception of the campus racial climate may inhibit their perceived sense of belonging. Racial climate includes both perceived micro-aggressions and perceived racial conflict.

Micro-aggression

We used three items developed by Hurtado et al. (2013) to measure micro-aggressions, measured on a three-point scale from "frequently" = 1 to "not at all" =3:

- Felt insulted or threatened by other students because of your race or ethnicity.
- Felt excluded from school activities because of your race or ethnicity, and
- Heard faculty make inappropriate comments about minorities.

Racial conflict

We used three items developed by Hurtado et al. (2013) to measure racial conflict, measured on a five-point scale from "strongly disagree" = 1 to 'strongly agree" = 5:

- There is a lot of racial conflict on campus,
- Students of different races or ethnicities communicate well with one another, and
- There is little trust between minority student groups and the campus administration.

Self-confidence

Additionally, there are factors that inhibit or contribute to student academic and social integration that we will measure. African American students struggle to believe in themselves, and this is measured through academic self-efficacy. Changes in student perceptions of academic self-efficacy depend upon the student's ease of transition into campus life, and subsequent cognitive mapping and ability to manage resources.

Academic self-efficacy

We measured the student's perceived changes in academic self-efficacy. Academic self-efficacy refers to a student's beliefs about his or her ability to successfully perform required tasks. We measured changes in perceived self-efficacy using the four items in the Perceived Self-Efficacy subscale from the Student Approaches to Learning (Marsh et. al, 2006), measured along a four-point scale from "almost never" = 1 to "almost always" = 4:

- I'm certain I can understand the most difficult material presented in textbooks,
- I'm confident I can understand the most complex material presented by my instructors,
- I'm confident I can do an excellent job on assignments and tests, and
- I'm certain I can master the skills being taught.

Fear regarding educational and career goals

We measured the student's perceived fear regarding educational and career goals with two items along a four-point scale from "not fearful" = 1 to "very fearful" = 4:

- Rate your level of fear regarding graduating and/or transferring to a four year institution, and
- Rate your level of fear regarding succeeding in your career.

Ease of transition

We measured the student's ease of transition into campus life. The student's ease of transition into campus life includes changes in cognitive mapping and increased ability to manage resources (Hurtado et. al, 1997).

We used the four items developed by Hurtado et al. (1997) to measure cognitive mapping, measured on a four-point scale from "very difficult" = 1 to "very easy" = 4:

- Seeking help when I needed it,
- Getting to know my way around,
- · Communicating with instructors, and
- Making new friends.

We used the three items developed by Hurtado et al. (1997) to measure managing resources, measured on a four-point scale from "very difficult" = 1 to "very easy" = 4:

- Staying on a schedule,
- · Managing my time effectively, and
- · Managing money effectively.

Awareness of financial aid

Access to financial aid helps alleviate some of the financial stressors students encounter pursuing an education. However, students need to know that financial aid is available, and where to get help in navigating the process of application and acceptance. We intended to measure awareness of financial aid through the number of students who complete a financial aid workshop and the number of students who are receiving financial aid; however, data on the number of students who participated in a financial aid workshop was not available.

Intermediate Outcomes

The intermediate outcomes of the program activities follow directly from the short-term outcomes, tracking the student's academic and social integration into the institution, measured through changes in academic performance and student persistence.

Long-Term Outcomes

The long-term outcomes of the program activities follow directly from the intermediate outcomes, tracking the student's academic and social integration into the institution, measured through progression from basic skills to transfer level coursework, student retention and student completion.

Discussion of Challenges Faced in Obtaining Data CCCCO Data

ISR reviewed the data request that the Umoja Community had prepared for the CCCCO and suggested revisions to the request. After attending meeting with the CCCCO, the Umoja Community entered into an MOU with the Chancellor's Office in order to obtain the data. ISR received the data files from the CCCCO in the second week of Oct 2017. ISR reviewed the data files and immediately identified that the files only contained New African American students who entered during a fall term, and that the number of unique Umoja students in the files was just over 500, less than a fourth of Umoja students enrolled during this time frame. ISR communicated this problem to the Umoja Community, but they were not able to not send a revised request to the CCCCO until the end of Jan 2017. The CCCCO responded to this request indicating that they would not be able to work on this task until May 2017. However, despite repeated requests the CCCCO never provided the revised data set.

Data Collection from Umoja Campus Coordinators

In early discussions about data collection, the Umoja Community identified three data collection challenges: identifying all Umoja participants, identifying Umoja courses, and the collection of email addresses for the Umoja participants. Although the CCCCO special population data file has an Umoja status field, the Umoja Community senior staff felt that campus coordinators were using this field inconsistently, and that relying solely upon this field would result in underrepresenting the population of Umoja students. The second challenge identified was that there was no variable to identify Umoja courses within the CCCCO data. The third challenge was the need to compile a complete list of email addresses for all Umoja students so that ISR could manage the data collection of survey data.

The only source for these three types of data was the campus coordinators; therefore, ISR worked with the Umoja Community Education Foundation to develop a data collection plan and condensed timeline to collect the necessary information from campus coordinators, before distributing the student survey. Upon approval of the plan and timeline, ISR designed data collection instruments and instructions using a secure software tool to collect necessary student data (students Ids, student email addresses, and Umoja course information) from campus coordinators. ISR conducted internal testing of the tool with ISR staff and the Umoja Community and participated in conference calls with Umoja regional coordinators and campus coordinators to discuss the workplan and the upcoming data collection from campus coordinators. Upon feedback from the coordinators, ISR made adjustments to the data collection instruments, instructions, and the workplan.

The Umoja Community sent out a letter notifying all coordinators that data collection was starting. There were some initial concerns expressed by a few coordinators about sharing student information. ISR discussed the concerns with the Umoja Community Education Foundation. They reached out to the CCCCO for clarification regarding the issue. The Umoja Community Education Foundation was confident that sharing data would not be a problem, and that they had resolved the issue with the coordinators, and instructed ISR to distribute the data collection instruments and instruction to the campus coordinators two days before the Annual Umoja Conference.

ISR distributed the data collection instruments and instructions to the campus coordinators before heading to the conference to provide on-site technical assistance. However, over the next several days more campus coordinators raised concerns over the sharing of student information with ISR for the purposes of this evaluation. ISR conferred with the Umoja Community about possible solutions, including obtaining consent to release information from students. Umoja Community suspended data collection so that they could reach out the CCCCO for clarification regarding the issue. Two months later, the Umoja Community received a letter from the Chancellor's Office, which they hoped would resolve the issue with data sharing. When that did not resolve the issue, they made the decision to collect the data using a new Umoja database that was under development through a separate contract (Kandia Consulting).

Umoja Database

ISR worked with the Umoja Community and Kandia Consulting to identify the data fields needed from the campus coordinators and to draft correspondence to the campus coordinators (March and April 2017). ISR requested sample data files from Kandia Consulting, and attempted to match the student Id data from two campuses and course information from one campus to the CCCCO data. ISR finally received test files in July 2017; ISR was able to successfully match the course information; however, none of the students Ids in either file matched the CCCCO data.

In the Fall of 2017, ISR spoke with the Umoja Community about moving forward with the project. ISR requested the rest of the data that Kandia Consulting had collected from campuses to see if it would match to the CCCCO data. ISR attempted to match students Ids from 10 campuses and none matched the CCCCO data. ISR was able to successfully identify Umoja courses for 18 campuses, the rest provided insufficient data for a match. The Umoja Community reached out again to the CCCCO to get revised data files and to ask them to try and match the students Ids to their system files, however they were not successful in obtaining revised data files.

Umoja Student Survey

In October 2016, ISR also drafted the student survey, revised the survey based upon feedback from the Umoja Executive Director, and contacted the CSUS IRB regarding Human Subjects Review of the project (project did not require review).

With data collection of student email addresses on hold, ISR and the Umoja Community agreed to drop the Fall 2016 survey administration altogether. ISR suggested the addition of measures assessing campus racial climate and discrimination observed by the students following the presidential election. When it became apparent that it would not be possible to collect student email addresses for the distribution of the student survey, ISR agreed to provide the survey as an anonymous link that the Umoja Community would share on their website, so that students could take the survey at the upcoming regional conference planned for April 2017.

ISR worked with the Umoja Community, regional coordinators, and campus coordinators on additional revisions to the student survey from January thru March 2017, in preparation for the Umoja Regional conference in April 2017. Technical difficulties prevented the Umoja Community from administering the survey during the event. ISR made the final revisions to the student survey in April 2017 and helped draft a letter to campus coordinators asking them to administer the survey to their students in class before the end of the semester. The Umoja Community sent the letter to the campus coordinators in the first week of May 2017. However, this yielded less than 300 responses by the end of June 2017. The Umoja Community continued to collect survey data throughout 2017 and into the beginning of 2018. In April 2018, ISR and Umoja Community agreed to move forward in finalizing the evaluation using the survey data and the limited set of CCCCO data files that the CCCCO had provided to ISR.


