Workshop session schedule: We are accepting proposals in two formats: 60 minute and 75 minute interactive workshops. A minimum of 15 minutes of the session should be reserved for questions from the audience.

Format: The presenter can determine the presentation format. We encourage you to choose a presentation that engages and educates the participants.

Presenter role: If you plan to use PowerPoint, presenters are required to bring their own laptop. We will provide a screen, projector, podium, podium mic, and wireless microphone.

Handouts: In respect to the environment, we are encouraging all presenters to limit handouts only as necessary or provide to the Umoja Office for posting on the Umoja website.

Fee: There will be no honorarium or reimbursement for the presentation. The selected presenters will receive a discounted registration rate of \$395. We encourage you to <u>register now</u>. If you are selected as a presenter, we will reimburse you the difference of the full registration.

Deadline: Proposals are due no later than Friday, September 21, 2018.

Notification: Those submitting proposals will be notified by <u>Monday, October 1, 2018</u> regarding the status of their proposal.

Proposal Submissions

All proposals will be evaluated by our program committee based on content, level of engagement of the presenters with students, and relevancy to the workshop strands below. The purpose is to identify presenters with interest, passion and expertise on the selected topic. **Proposal submissions will only be accepted by submitting through this link.**

You will need the following information to submit a proposal:

- 1. Presenter name
- 2. Company/college affiliation
- 3. Contact information (email and telephone)
- 4. Workshop Strands (must align with one of the six conference strands below)
- 5. Presentation Title (should excite and inspire the audience in under 15 words)
- 6. Session Description: What will the audience learn? How will they be transformed? (maximum 150 words)
- 7. List 2 3 key learning objectives
- 8. Additional panelists name and company/college affiliation
- 9. Whether you plan to use a PowerPoint presentation

Umoja Community Guided Pathways Strategies

These workshops will focus on examples of how Umoja programs are engaging the California Community College Guided Pathways Initiative.

Student Leadership

The Umoja Community integrates leadership training and opportunities for our students. Programs across the state support student leadership groups. These student leaders are doing a broad range of initiatives and activities on their campuses to build community and foster student success. These workshops will focus on how student leaders are developing themselves and the activities and strategies they are using on their campuses.

Black Minds Matter

The teaching and counseling style of Umoja emphasizes empowerment in our students, relevance in our curriculum, and respect for the minds of our students so they experience their own voices as important in

our classrooms and programs. These workshops will focus on pedagogical strategies that transform equity into action.

These workshops will focus on making transfer a reality for every community college student.
